WINDHAM, NH- Surrounded by over 120 family members and friends Lieutenant Colonel (LTC) Walter J. D. Hewitt, USA (Ret.), turned 100 years old this past Sunday, the 31st of August 2014. Walter's wife of over 63 years Mrs. Veronica "Roni" Hewitt, and his son Colonel Doug Hewitt, USA (Ret.), hosted Walt's birthday gala on Labor Day at the Searles Castle in Windham. Walter graduated from ROTC at Norwich University as a member of the Class of 1936 and went on active duty in 1939. He entered military service at Fort Ethan Allen and was a member of 1st Squadron, 3rd Cavalry Regiment. During World War II, LTC Hewitt served as the Battalion Executive Officer for 2nd Battalion, 133rd Infantry Regiment which was a subordinate unit of the 34th Infantry Division. LTC Hewitt's unit saw brutal action in Northern Italy at Apennines Pass and in the PO Valley. His long and distinguished career culminated with his assignment as a training battalion commander at the Armor School at Fort Knox, Kentucky in 1959.
