More than 102 people attended the ceremony.

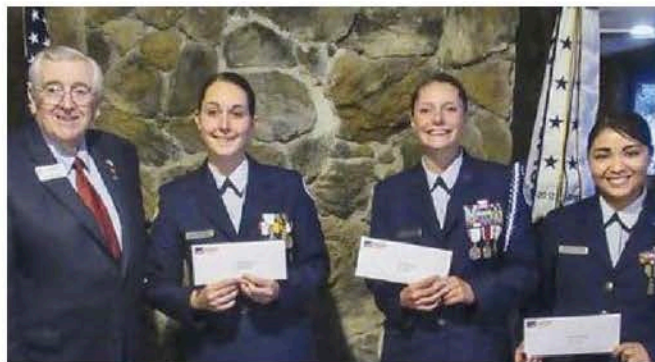
Green Valley (Ariz.) Chapter
