The New Hampshire Military Officers Association Honors Senator Kelly Ayotte

CONCORD, NH- Commander Bruce Avery USN (Ret.), President of the New Hampshire Chapter of the Military Officers Association of America (NHMOAA), honored U.S. Senator Kelly Ayotte (R-NH) Thursday night at the monthly Board of Directors meeting for her bi-partisan support of the 157th Air Refuel Wing, New Hampshire Air National Guard's, national bid to be selected for the U.S. Air Force (USAF) KC-46 fielding at Pease Air National Guard Base. The Boeing KC-46 is a military aerial refueling and strategic transport aircraft developed by Boeing from its 767 jet airliner. In February 2011, the tanker was selected by the USAF as the winner in the KC-X tanker competition to replace older KC-135 Stratotankers. U.S. Senator Kelly Ayotte (R-NH), along with U.S. Senator Jeanne Shaheen (D-NH), worked tirelessly the past 18 months in a combined and bi-partisan effort to highlight the strengths of the New Hampshire Air National Guard and the countless reasons that Pease Air National Guard Base should be chosen by the USAF for the fielding. In May 2013, the U.S. Air Force did just that. "It is an honor to present to you a token of our thanks and gratitude, not only for your efforts regarding the KC-46, but for what you do for all military members and their families as part of the Senate Armed Forces Committee" Avery said. Senator Ayotte was overjoyed by the presentation but acknowledged that any individual effort she made was part of a greater bi-partisan initiative.

Commander Avery took the opportunity to ask Senator Ayotte about issues of utmost concern to the members of the NHMOAA. When queried about the long term effects of sequestration, Senator Ayotte said "although sometimes you can't always see the immediate effects of something like sequestration, and while the military will cobble its way through the next couple years, in the end we wind up with a hollow force. Sequestration is not sustainable for the next 10 years." Ayotte indicated "I am all-in when it comes to finding resolution to this very important national defense issue."
