In the News:

July 3: The Military Officers Association of America (MOAA) said The Military Compensation and Retirement Modernization Commission interim report released July 3 validated MOAA's analysis that military personnel costs have remained steady at about 30 percent of the defense budget. This is in sharp contrast to the 40-, 50-, or 70percent increases various DoD and service officials have stated to the media, the public, and Congress. Congress created the commission to conduct an independent, comprehensive review of military compensation and benefit programs and make recommendations for their modernization.

"Unbelievably, after repeatedly crowing that costs were spiraling out of control, DoD leaders are now saying costs are dropping due to their plan" <u>MOAA President Vice Adm. Norb Ryan said</u>. "DoD officials recently acknowledged military personnel costs are coming down and even claimed "We are making progress."

Martin Roy will celebrate his 100th birthday with some very personal gifts that were earned rather than purchased. Roy officially becomes a <u>centenarian</u> on Tuesday, which also happens to be Veterans Day. In recognition of both, his family managed to get him replacements for some of the medals and ribbons he received



for his service in the Navy during World War II.

"I was very surprised," Roy said, seated comfortably in a room full of family and friends at Intervale, NH Country Club. There were also some visitors who were there to thank Roy personally for his service and wish him a happy 100th. U.S. Sen. Kelly Ayotte, Mayor Ted Gatsas and Cdr. David Kenney of the Navy Operational Support Center were all in attendance.

Martin's son, Paul Roy, said he also sent copies of military records documenting the service of his father from 1943-45. Among the documents the family has preserved is a letter of thanks written to Roy shortly after he was honorably discharged from the Navy. The letter was signed by James Forrestal, who was Secretary of the Navy at the time and would be appointed the country's first Secretary of Defense.

Oct 09, 2014 <u>Tricare</u> is no longer sending most beneficiaries notices by postal mail and instead will be pushing them through the Defense Department's Milconnect website according to a new Defense Department plan announced Oct. 1. Effective immediately, users will no longer receive notifications about Tricare
