The NH World Famous Clambake, PNSY 5 August 2023!

In the recent past, Mother Nature has not always been kind to our annual clambake, and I was beginning to worry that was going to be the case again this year. Fortunately, the rainy and windy weather cleared out of the area earlier that moring and we ended up with a perfectly delightful bright sunny day. Right on schedule, our President, Jim LeFebvre, called everyone to attention, and asked the Portsmith Naval Shipyard Color Guard to present the colors, and everyone recited the Pledge of

Allegiance and sang the natioal anthem. This was followed by a brief invocation. After the colors were retired, Jim said a few introductory remarks before introducing both Senator

Maggie Hassen and Congressman Chris Pappas. Senator Hassen spent about five minutes discussing the PACT act that was passed by Congress last year concerning compensation for exposures to toxic substances. She emphasized that the initial application for these benefits needed to be submitted to the VA no later than midnight of August 9th. The VA later amended this date and delayed it to August 14th.

Although Congressman Pappas was also present, he elected not to make any specific comments so that the program could proceed without further delays.

The president said that "a total of one hundred and sixty-five members and guests paid to attend and got to enjoy each other's company, while swapping "war and sea" stories, all of which were beyond doubt factual, and funny to boot." Jim expressed his personal thanks to the two key leaders of the event, Gary Terhune and Chad Chadwick, for without their hard work, attention to detail, and the like, the event would not

have been nearly as much fun or successful. He also thanked all of the MOAA-NH Board of Director members and other chapter members who pitched in and made this event a success. In addition to our Congressional guests, we were happy

to have the PNSY Commander, Captain Michael Oberdorf and his wife, the southern Maine MOAA Chapter President, Brenda Pennels, and two representatives from MOAA National Headquarters, James O'Brien and Frank Michael. Attendees

enjoyed a wonderful helping of clam chowder immediately after the opening ceremonies, and over the next hour were served either their steak or lobster along with boiled potatoes, salad, rolls and butter, and corn on the cob. Both alcoholic and non-alcoholic drinks

were served as part of the meal. For dessert, we all enjoyed slices of water melon. As there were fewer people using Jamaica Island that day, members and guests were able to move into some of the other pavilions. I hope everyone is looking forward to next year's event!

Tin Mountain Luncheon

On June 17th, 62 members, guests, and family members traveled to the North Country to attend our very first luncheon at the Tin Mountain Conservation Center in Albany, NH. Unfortunately, due to heavy rain most of the day, we were unable to participate in any optional outdoor activities, but we had a grand picnic lunch in the main meeting room where we had the opportunity to gather and enjoy ourselves while dining and listening to a great presentation by members of the NH ARNG Aviation Section regarding mountain rescues. Beer for sale was graciously provided by Tuckerman Brewing and our own Gary Lovgren provided the wine for sale. The picnic style luncheon included pulled port sandwiches, fried chicken, and various salads, such as potato and macaroni, were available as well as non-alcoholic beverages catered by Sweet Maple Cafe. Nancy Devine, current President of the Board of Directors, provided us with a brief history of the center and the efforts to expand their conservation and research activities since moving to this location. After lunch, we all listened to an informative PowerPoint presentation by CW3 Luke Koladish, one of the Blackhawk pilots, and SFC Aaron Angelis, the unit flight instructor, on the missions of the aviation section of the NH ARNG, primarily focusing on the aeromedical/rescue activities of the six HH-60 Blackhawks assigned to the 238th Medevac Unit. They spoke to us about two relatively recent mountain rescues and the missions of the other two units, the 169th with four assigned HH-60L Blackhawks which are mainly used to transport personnel and other logistical movements, and the one C-12 (Beechcraft KingAir) assigned primarily to move headquarters staff around the state. Because of the rainy weather and the center having to prepare for another group visiting the center later that afternoon, our luncheon broke up and we all headed home around 2:30 pm. Hopefully, we'll haven another opportunity to visit in the future.

Travel Notes from the Editor: For those of you who haven't flown commercially lately and gone through a TSA checkpoint, you might be unpleasantly surprised if you try to use your military retired ID card and it has an "Indefinite" expiration date on it. These cards are no longer being accepted due to equipment and software upgrades and you'll need to use any picture ID card or upgrade your current military ID card. To find an ID RAPIDS location, use: https://idco.dmdc.osd.mil/idco/locator to location a location near you. If you are in the Concord area, I would recommend going to the one on the grounds of the NH Joint Military Headquarters in Building "C". SSgt Hadley is excellent in processing ID card applications and my wife and I were in and out in less than 20 minutes. I would not recommend using the office at the 99th RSC Headquarters in Londonderry as it is not very "user" friendly. A Breuder, Editor

UPDATES TO HANSCOM RAO

There were two items from the Hanscom RAO. First, there will be an Air Force 76th Birthday celebration at the Minuteman Commons (the former Officer's Club) at 1500 hours on 18 September 2023. There was also an attachment to this notification regarding some items, including safety items, that are available at the base Commissary.

Second, there was a lengthy document that stated that as of 1 Sep 23, all civilian Retired DOD Civilian ID's would no longer be valid for use for installation access to any DOD installation worldwide. Any DOD Civilian Retiree wanting access will need to register for access at each DOD Installation's Visitor Control Center that they wish access to. They will need proof of ID and their Standard Form-50 as proof of retirement. If you have a REAL ID driver's license, you can gain access to the installation.
